FLAGSHIP SPECIES

The Protected Area of
Mahimborondro is characterised
by a **dense evergreen forest** over
almost half its area. Three plant
species are known only from
Mahimborondro. The site is also
home to a rich, rare, threatened
animal biodiversity, including the
Madagascar red owl, classified
as a vulnerable species, or the
chameleon *Calumma hafahafa*,
considered as a critically
endangered species.

PROTECTED AREA SPECIFICITIES

LANDSCAPES AND HABITATS



Mid-altitude, dense, humid evergreen forest; ericoid mountain thicket; secondary meadows and pastures; marshes.

PRESSURES AND THREATS



Selective logging, exploitation of forest products for commercial or domestic purposes, clearing, fires, informal mining activities

ECONOMIC VALUE

The NPA of Mahimborondro is a major water reservoir for surrounding watersheds, feeding the region's main rivers and playing a vital role in agriculture and livestock farming (especially rice growing).



LOCAL COMMUNITIES' **INITIATIVES**

In terms of management, TPF works closely with local communities, in particular the Vondron'Olona Ifotony (VOIs) (basic communities) established in and around the NPA. Local communities participate in conservation activities such as patrols, participatory ecological monitoring, monitoring and surveillance of forest product harvesting. The VOIs also take part in ecological restoration and reforestation activities, as well as in the implementation of sub-projects designed to improve their living conditions while ensuring the protection of the NPA's biodiversity.



FAPBM'S EFFORTS AND **RESULTS**

FAPBM's financial support to the New Protected Area (NPA) of Mahimborondro began in 2024. The grant is intended for the implementation of conservation activities (inventory and research, restoration and construction of conservation infrastructure) and support for communities. It also partially covers the salaries and operating costs of the management unit.
